Dear Parents,
Can you please note the following:

Around the Classes

Our Foundation/1 class have been looking at the letters D and H and learning about the structure of a sentence **(English)**. In **Mathematics** the Foundation students have been looking at subtraction, while the Grade 1's have been exploring addition of two digit numbers using MAB (concrete materials). In **Science** they have been studying germs and conducting experiments to discover the 'germiest' areas in the school.

A word of warning don't eat off the hallway floor!

Meanwhile the Grade 2/3 class have been using the Safeway superhero tokens to explore the concepts of data representation and probability **(Mathematics)**. We opened 25 packets to make a graph of the different colours and to predict the probability of getting a certain colour or number. In **English** we have undertaken a comparison of the text in our class novel *James and the Giant Peach* and the storyline in the movie.

Amazing the number of differences!
We have been using the app *iMovie* to create a trailer for *James and the Giant Peach* (**Technology**).

And finally, our Grade 4/5 class have been exploring *Worry Warts* as their class novel, learning about plurals and adverbs (**English**). In Mathematics they have been making graphs based on their sports results and interpreting these. In **Science** they have been looking at the skeletal system and are undertaking a research project on an organ in the body or a sense.
